

# Why Open Innovation Workshops?

Open Innovation Workshops focus on **creating a cross-fertilization process among representative stakeholders** of the Smart Health community, to co-design and co-develop solutions answering the current sectorial challenges.

This type of Workshop leverages an **SME-centric open innovation methodology**. Targeted stakeholders are invited through Open Innovation Workshops to participate in brainstorming, generation of project leads and elaboration of roadmaps for the implementation of new Smart Health solutions. This proposed collaborative approach allows participants to generate project ideas and co-design solutions.

#### The main objectives are:

- · to explore in-depth the needs of the healthcare sector,
- · to discover technological solutions that address real-word challenges,
- to generate innovative ideas, and
- to support the emergence of cross-sectoral collaborative research, development and innovation/technology transfer projects.

## 6. Integration of social and technological dimensions

Include end users, patients, and social innovators to ensure solutions are both technically sound and socially relevant.



### 7. Usage of digital collaboration tools

Use accessible, open-source tools for project management and co-creation to enhance transparency and efficiency in cross-country collaborations and during the sessions.

#### 5. Continuous feedback and follow-up

Extend engagement beyond the event through digital platforms, surveys, and mentoring to refine ideas and track implementation.




#### 4. Skilled facilitation and process management

In each session, combine an experienced Open Innovation expert with a skilled moderator to keep discussions focused, inclusive, and solution-oriented.

#### 3. Use of structured methodologies

Use frameworks such as Design Thinking, Lean Startup, and Value Mapping to guide ideation, document progress, and link creativity to actionable outcomes.

#### 2. Clear definition of objectives and governance

Set clear goals, roles, and governance structures. Assign coordinators or "idea owners" and establish follow-up mechanisms like steering committees to maintain momentum.

#### 1. Early and inclusive stakeholder engagement

Start with thorough stakeholder mapping and involve stakeholders from academia, healthcare, industry, and civil society from the beginning to build trust and ensure diverse perspectives.

Open Innovation Workshops are most effective when **facilitation** is structured, participation is inclusive and interactive, and roles and responsibilities are clearly defined.

When these elements come together, the impact goes far beyond simple idea generation. Success depends on sustained stakeholder engagement, transparent communication, and the seamless integration of technological and social perspectives. In this environment, ideas are not just discussed — they evolve into meaningful and lasting solutions.
