

The EU-funded SHIFT-HUB project reaching its Halfway Point

The **EU-funded project** <u>SHIFT-HUB</u>, aimed at the creation of a pan-European Smart Innovation Hub, has now successfully hit the **halfway point** of its **3-year journey**. Given its ambitious objective, the first months of the project were crucial in setting the management approach, defining the time plan, the activities to carry out and the results to be achieved throughout the project, with the purpose of ensuring a smooth and effective cooperation.

Thanks to the SHIFT-HUB consortium's commitment and hard work, it was possible to record multiple early successes thought to enrich the services for the **patient-centric community**.

Particularly, SHIFT-HUB offerings include:

- Involvement Services including community building and engagement facilitation
- Srowth Services through comprehensive support in a cross-fertilisation process
- Route-to-Market Services helping technology providers access funding and supporting discovery, demonstration, and test-before-invest activities.

Given the project's nature, the SHIFT-HUB consortium launched its <u>community</u> consisting of **health practitioners** and **organizations**, **technology**, **knowledge** and **infrastructure providers**, **innovation intermediaries**, **public authorities**, and **individual citizens**. Through a simple registration process, members receive updates on events, materials, and project-promoted opportunities.

Among the <u>relevant events</u> organised by SHIFT-HUB, the project hosted **two International Conferences** on Smart Health Innovation and Future technologies, **Demo Days**, **Living Labs**, an outstanding **International Brokerage Event** and **Access to Funding workshops**.

Educational Resources: Bridging the Digital Gap

Recognizing the **need to upskill healthcare workers and enhance digital capabilities** of the general public, the <u>SHIFT-HUB Catalogue of educational resources</u> was developed. This online repository, comprising **189 resources across 15 thematic categories**, addresses essential topics such as AI, data science, cybersecurity, and smart health applications. These resources cater to healthcare professionals, patients, entrepreneurs, SMEs, companies, and students, contributing to narrowing disparities in digital skills.
