The services David found most valuable included the Open Innovation Workshops, Living Labs, and Demo Days. Through these services, he has been able to enhance collaboration and innovation in his work.

IDIAPJGol operates the **Real World Lab**, a living lab designed to support large and medium-sized companies, start-ups, spin-offs, and research centers in co-creating, validating, and testing medical devices or any product focused on primary care. With access to 36 research groups, over 10,000 professionals (including general practitioners, nurses, psychologists, and physiotherapists), and SIDIAP (one of the largest primary care databases in the world), IDIAPJGol serves a population of 8 million patients in both rural and urban areas.
